- Secretary - last month's Minutes were read by Mary C.
- Treasurer - Tina Dychkowski - **Club acct** (+ \$60 for memberships, \$224 from Studie BBQ, \$50 from 50/50) (- \$6.31 for 1 name badge) ending balance = \$3,467.03. **Show acct** (+ \$6,483.50 various deposits) (- \$3,040.50 for Show T-shirts, \$53.97 Registration supplies, \$1,786.89 Trophies, \$760.41 Burger Burn supplies, \$201.88 Hospitality & Goodie bags, \$790 cash for Show seed money) ending balance = \$12,573.46

Ken thanked each Show committee chair for their dedication in making such a great Show.  
The "Best Studebaker" was awarded to Ken Michael. Since he is a RCCAC member, he was not eligible for this award so he gave the award back to the Club. Because of the unusual circumstances with giving out this award this year, new guidelines will be made for the distribution of trophies when a conflict arises.

We will be changing the venue of the car show from the casino to either Green Valley Park or to Main St. The members at the meeting were asked to vote on one of these venues as well as to write down their comments about trophy selections.

The Car Show Survey that Participants found in their Registration packets was reviewed. We received a 10% return on the surveys. The Participants overwhelmingly chose taking the Show back to the Park for the shade and grass.

The monies spent and received for the Car Show was explained. Overall \$7,375.50 was spent, we made \$17,461.50, so the total net made from the show was \$10,086.00. We will need to change the date of the Show as our usual Show date is not available for the Park. The 2 new dates the members were to vote on is May 3,4 or October 18, 19.

- New AZ driving laws:
  - Defensive Driving School can now be done once a year to wipe out a ticket from your record. Used to be available only once every 2 years.
  - Functioning vehicle lights are mandatory in 2017. Each and every light on your vehicle must function without a flaw. If any light is not functioning, an AZ police officer can pull you over and he has a right to search your car. It was determined that police can use these stops as sufficient probable cause to perform a search which is admissible and legal in every regard. You cannot claim harassment.
  - Good Samaritan Law - Any health provider, ambulance attendant, driver, pilot, or any other person who renders emergency care at a public gathering or at a scene of an emergency occurrence gratuitously and in good faith shall not be liable for any civil or other damages as the result of any act or omission by such person rendering emergency care, or as the result of any act or failure of act to provide or arrange for further medical treatment or care for the injured persons, unless such person, while rendering such emergency care, is guilty of gross negligence.
