Getting to know

Jim & Linda Barrett.

Their story was printed in the October 2015 Chevy Classics magazine and they are happy to share it with us.

We bought our 1965 Malibu Super Sport from a fellow worker in Omaha, NE. The car was originally purchased in California and

brought to the Omaha area in 1980. I bought the car in 1988 and used it as a daily driver

until 1994. My wife Linda and I are the 5th owners.

Linda and I started the restoration project once the Chevelle had retired from it's daily driver duties. It took us about 2 years of hard work - and my son Pat was invaluable helping us on the engine. The car looked bone stock inside and out when we were finished. We took it to its first car show in the summer of 1998, and won a 2nd place trophy. Not bad!

We got a little tired of the stock look and decided to turn our Chevelle into an 1.79 clone with an in-dash tach and dash-mounted clock. The engine had a 350 horsepower decal, and L79 air cleaner, and a Chevelle Sport Wood Steering Wheel.

After moving to Arizona in 1999, we decided to start all over again. This time we had Vintage Air installed. We took everything off the firewall and smoothed it out. We routed



the heater and the air

condition hoses inside the fender wells for a neater and cleaner look in the engine compartment. We also added a larger custom –built radiator.

By the summer of last year, the 327 engine was getting tired. We headed to Reno for the Hot August Nights event, where we purchased a ZZ5 GM crate engine and a Hughes 700R4 transmission. That took us all winter to install, but it was so worth it.

As of this writing, our Chevelle has never left us walking. We believe it is a car to drive and have fun with. We have driven it to Coeur d' Alene, ID, Las Vegas, and Reno NV, Albuquerque and Silver City, NM. Springfield and Kansas City, MO, and Tucson and Flagstaff, AZ. It has also been to many show'n'shines in our area. We have been to three Bow Tie International shows. The car has always scored in the high 900s with 2 best of show paint awards.

Thanks go out to my wife first, who not only puts up

with me, but has been a great help. Also to my son Pat, Chalek's Auto Body in Bellevue, NE and all my car friends in Payson, AZ where we live. They have all helped us make the Chevelle a great car!
