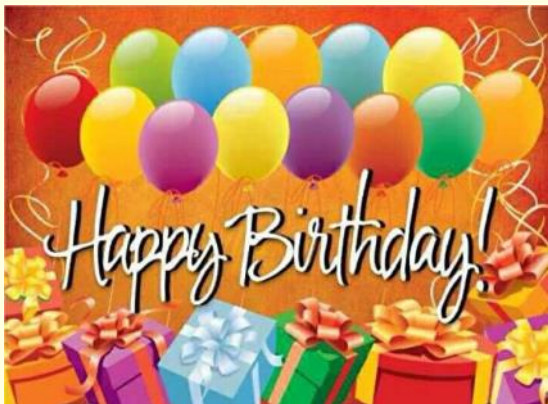

August 5th This is still a **"KEEP YOUR DISTANCE CRUISE"**



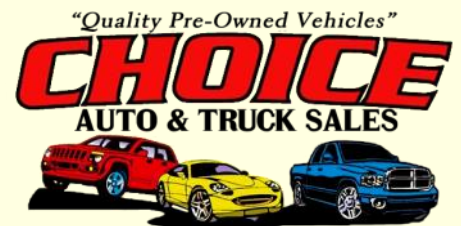
Going to be doing the cruise we did back in May "Cruise #1" a map will again be sent out with instructions and there will also be printed copies at the meeting place.

Did you know?

The world's first Drive-In Theater was invented in the backyard of one Richard Hollingshead in the early 30's. Richard nailed a screen to a tree and used a 1928 Kodak projector on the hood of his car with a radio behind the screen for sound.

In 1933, Richard opened his "real" Drive-In Theater in Camden, New Jersey. Admission was 25 cents and the sound was projected via a directional system by RCA Victor... great for cars, not so good for neighbors.



PAGE 4 During this year of the pandemic a lot of people have been doing gardening and that means lots of zucchini . If you didn't plant any this year your friends and neighbors might have and need someone to take some off their hands. I have included a wonderful recipe that has become one of my summer and winter favorites. Freeze a few generous grated cups for the winter. Enjoy!

LEMON ZUCCHINI BREAD

This Lemon Zucchini Bread combines two favorites in one delicious loaf of bread! Topped with a sweet lemony glaze, it's a great way to sneak in extra veggies and the BEST way to wake up!

Servings 1 loaf

Ingredients

- 1 1/2 c. all-purpose flour
- 1/2 tsp. baking soda
- 1/4 tsp. baking powder
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 3/4 c. sugar
- 1 C. shredded unpeeled zucchini
(do not squeeze or dry shredded zucchini)
- 1/4 c. cooking oil
- 1 egg
- 2 Tbsp. lemon juice
- 2 Tbsp. lemon zest

Glaze

- 1/2 c. powdered sugar
- 1 Tbsp. lemon juice
- 1 tsp. lemon zest

Instructions

1. In a medium mixing bowl combine flour, baking soda, baking powder, and salt; set aside.
2. In a separate mixing bowl combine sugar, cooking oil, egg, lemon juice, lemon zest, Zucchini (see NOTE below) Stir to combine.
3. Add dry ingredients to zucchini mixture; stir just until combined.
4. Spoon batter into greased bread pan.
5. Bake at 350 degrees for 50-55 minutes or until golden brown and set.
6. Cool in pan on a wire rack 15 min, then remove from pan and cool completely.
7. Once cool, combine ingredients for glaze and drizzle over bread.

NOTE* When making a large batch (X6) I found it was better to do all the liquids first then add the dry. In another large bowl have the zucchini, pour the batter into the zucchini and mix by hand. It goes together pretty fast as the zucchini has lots of moisture.

****Don't be stingy with the zucchini for that cup I packed it pretty well and heaped it!**
