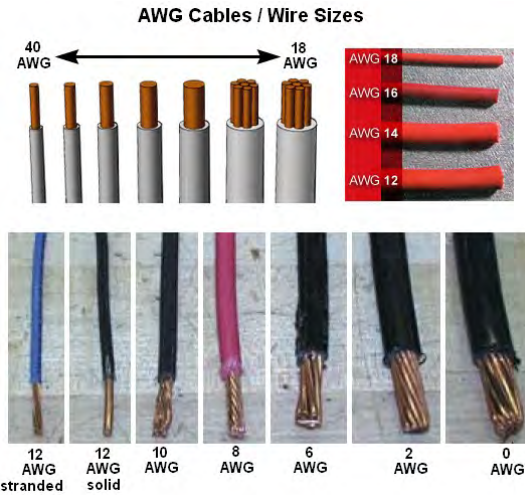
Know How to Get Wired!

Correctly....



So, Garage / shop “art” has gone through some major changes over the years. Well, here is a shop “pin-up” that can be very helpful when installing that accessory such as cooling fans, remote fuel pumps, A/C systems, etc. Just because you used a relay to protect the control switch from major current flow, you still have to run the proper wire size to and from the device being wired – and don’t forget to include a fuse / circuit breaker in the power wire, before the relay.

On the topic of relays, stick with OEM brands. Bosch is the “Cadillac” of relays and your local bone yard is full of them at cut rate prices. Can your ride do the “electric slide?” John
